JAPAN CUP

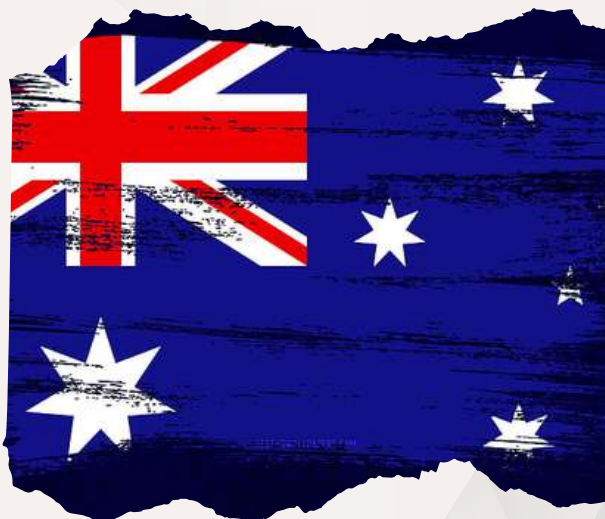
We are excited to announce that Bowls Singapore will be sending 2 teams to the upcoming Japan Cup which will be held between 13 - 15 September 2025.
